2018 Horse Show Notes

Premium

These pages are dedicated to explaining some of the notes on this year's horse show premium. You can use the extra space to make notes, keep track of your points and service hours, or to list any questions you may have that haven't already been answered. Hopefully you will find this information a useful tool in your quest to acquire the maximum number of points for the daily and year-end prizes.

- Classes numbered 1 through 48 are for those who are showing in English, Western, or Walk/Trot English/Western, Lead Line, and Ranch Riding. The classes that are required for day/year-end prizes are numbered in the Notes column. A list of the required classes (by name) is also posted in the bottom right hand corner of the premium. **Please note:** Classes #1,2,3, Showmanship in Hand E/W, are not listed as a requirement in English and W/T; however it does count towards day/year-end prizes. Class #27 Country Pleasure E/W is not required for any discipline but also count towards points if taken. It's a good way to add a few extra points to your overall total. Class 4, Halter, is paired with points from Classes 1, 2, or 3 for a year-end prize.
- Classes numbered 49 through 64 are for those who are showing in Gymkhana. Riders must compete in at least 3 out of 4 classes to qualify for day/year-end prizes. Gymkhana is a separate category and will not add to your English or Western points **unless** you are trying for the overall high point award. If that is the case, you must show at least 1 time in this category (all 4 classes for your age group). Depending on how many points you need to acquire in order to win, you may want to compete at several shows.
- A 5 second penalty will be added for each break in gait per class for all W/T riders in Gymkhana.
- All riders competing for day/year-end awards in any category must be members of ETI Corral 57 or an associate member and compete in at least 4 out of 6 shows. Be sure to keep your membership current. Riders must show in 3 out of 4 required classes for W/T, English, and Gymkhana; or 4 out of 5 classes

for Western; or 2 out of 3 classes for Ranch in order to qualify for day/year-end awards.

- All riders competing for year-end prizes must also complete at least 2 hours of service for the club. You may choose between our Trail Clean-Up Day, or you may log in your time by helping at one or more shows.
 - Our club is responsible for maintaining the first section of the Ojai Trail that leads from Foster Park up to the Recreation Center in Casitas Springs. It's about ¼ to ½ mile and every year we take a group of volunteer members to pick up trash and debris along the trail.
- As you know, it takes a team of people volunteering to work all of the various jobs at each show. The areas where help is most needed are as follows:
 - Setting up and taking down jumps for English and poles for Gymkhana
 - Ribbons
 - Ring steward
 - Arena gate
- Please check in with show chair Rhonda West if you plan on working at a show. There will be a sign-up sheet for recording your time.
- Points are posted at each show to help you keep track of your progress. Results are scored as follows:

Third	4	Sixth & below	1

All riders receive at least 1 point for each class entered. See the show premium under "Day and Year-End High Point" for list of required classes for high point awards.
